I know that I would heal much more slowly, and perhaps not at all, without the compassion and love of others. We need others.

I have also been deeply moved and saddened over the past week as I have watched the news of children separated from parents and other family members. Jesus made very particular reference to the Kingdom of God being connected to how we treat and care for children. My heart breaks when I see children that have been hurt. We are not separate from one another. God has created a human family in which to dwell. We must care for one another. Compassion is our only way forward as a family.

Amen. (Book of Common Prayer, p. 815.)

Report From Vestry on Rental House

For some time now, your Vestry has been working on reducing our dependence on our rental houses to make our annual budget. The five houses owned by St. Andrew's have always been intended as a resource for ministry. To that end, when the 2018 budget was accepted, the rent income from the house at 2011 Arendell Street was not included in the budget as income. It also happened that the house became unoccupied at the end of December.

In January, during one of the many cold, cold days, a water pipe burst in this house. Because the house was unoccupied, no one was aware of water spewing out throughout the interior. The damage was massive. Once, aware, the insurance company was contacted immediately and payment for the damage was made.

Now, your Vestry faced a decision. Should the house be renovated so that it could be re-rented? Should the house be torn down and in its place a building that might house the choir, more offices or Sunday Schools be built in its place? Should an additional parking lot be made?

Your Vestry struggled with this decision. There were frequent discussions during meetings, with each other and with members of the congregation, as members struggled to make a decision so vital to St. Andrew's and its members. There were pros and cons for every option.

There were two important issues. Which option fit best with the Long-Range Planning Committee as well as the congregation, and in which direction was the Holy Spirit leading us? At the June meeting, the chair of the Long-Range Planning Committee, Tricia Bowers-Young, met with the Vestry. She explained the results of the questions posed at the Long-Range Planning Committee's presentations at the past Wednesday night Lenten Series. Parishioners most frequently cited parking as a challenge needing to be met by the church.

Following the information, the decision came easily. "God moves in mysterious ways", but, on occasion, the path appears obvious: The vestry had already decided not to use rental income from that particular house. The parishioners who engaged in the Wednesday Night Supper Series, obviously saw the need for additional parking, and it appeared this path had been opened for us by the chain of events leading to it.

Finally, you may expect to see big changes to the property next door. We hope you are pleased.

What better way than to utilize our Thrift Store as a point of contact. Position Description

St. Andrew's is looking for a creative and energetic individual to serve as a part-time coordinator of children and youth ministries, focusing on program planning and development for our 40+ children and youth from birth through high school.

We are a medium-sized parish that values diversity and believes that following Jesus means serving others through various community outreach programs. We are looking for someone who shares our values and is willing to make a commitment to our church, its children, youth and families. This job requires organizational skills, a spirit of collaboration and teamwork, strong communication skills - orally, written and via various social media strategies, a sense of humor, and a sincere love of all God's people.

Job duties include but are not limited to:

- Coordinating, planning and sometimes leading children's chapel lessons that help our younger children understand and appreciate the liturgy;
- Recruiting and coordinating volunteers for assistance with programs and activities, including but not limited to: children's chapel, VBS, Faith and Family, junior and senior high youth groups;

- Network with vestry liaisons to coordinate community-building and leadership activities for the children and youth that includes volunteer work both within and outside of the church;
- Coordinate, plan and communicate junior and senior high youth group activities, serving as leader of either group when needed.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree, preferably in an area of child development. We will also consider candidates with equivalent experience.

This child and youth coordinator will work an average 20 hours/week, with approximately half of that during most weekends.
