Living Thanksgiving

A few months ago I began a new daily planner. I realize that it is somewhat unusual to start a new daily planner in the middle of the year, but I was looking for something that was both a calendar/organizer, and a personal goal-setting system. Also, I still like using a paper-based planner where I physically write stuff in. There is something about the physical pen-on-paper that encourages my creativity and keeps me grounded. I also still keep a daily journal. I have been journaling as a spiritual practice for most of my adult life. Anyway, the new daily planner/calendar encourages one to set three month goals, with daily tasks which will help you meet those goals. (It is called The Self Journal. I'll be glad to show mine to you if you'd like.)

I was interested to find that one of the most important daily tasks in their process is gratitude. They ask you to list three things you are grateful for, and why, each and every day. And, it has to be three different things every day. Over the course of thirteen weeks you will have written 273 things you are grateful for... 1,092 things you are grateful for in a year! The first few days it was pretty easy to think of three things I am grateful for. My wife, my family, my country, the right to vote, my church, clean water, a house... You get the point. But after a couple of weeks of not being able to repeat things, it took some time and reflection to come up with the daily three. I have really begun to enjoy reflecting on the day and on my life to find things for which I am grateful. It turns out that gratitude is like a muscle... The more you use it, the better you get at it. And we have to use it or lose it. We have to use this "gratitude muscle" or it will wither.

Christian author and researcher Diana Butler Bass has written her new book on the subject. It's called Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks. In the book she states that the Bible likens gratitude to a fruit of the spirit. "Gratitude is not only an

emotion; it is something we do," she writes. "It is like tending a garden. It takes planting and watering and weeding. It takes time and attention. It takes learning. It takes routine. But, eventually, the ground yields, shoots come forth, and thanksgiving blooms."

November is the month of Thanksgiving. So, it is a natural time for us to think about what we are grateful for. I would like to encourage us all... (I'm including myself) to practice gratitude on a daily basis, all year round. It is a spiritual practice that Jesus was very fond of, and which He encourages us to do. The word "eucharist," which we use for our communion service, is actually the Greek word for "Thanksgiving". All that we have is a gift from God. Living from that place of holy thanksgiving is what God intends for us. Philippians 4:6 says, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God." Colossians 3:15 says, "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body, and be thankful."

I am grateful for you. I am thankful to God for allowing me the joy of being your pastor-priest. I am grateful for what God is doing in and through us as a church.

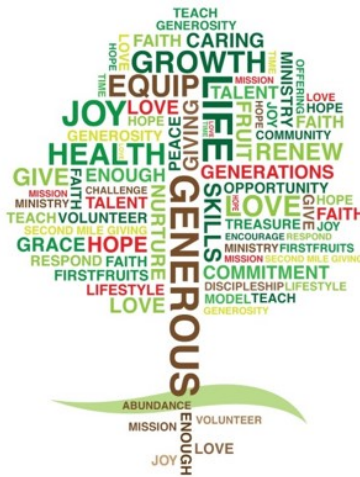

St. Andrew's Memorial Garden

Construction has started on the Memorial Garden which is located on the east side of the church bordered by the Parish Hall. When completed, parishioners will have the option of a columbarium or in-ground interment. A diagram of the plans is located on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall.

Included in the Garden, there are plans for two four-foot teak benches. The Vestry is looking for members who would like to contribute to donate a bench. The \$911 cost per bench includes engraving on the front top

back rail (up to 42 letters, numbers, spaces, etc.), a "golden" sealant, four bench anchors affixed to the pavers, and freight. A small packet about the bench details and a picture is available in the church office. Benches will be ordered by mid-December.

Long Range Planning

While it may seem like the long range planning has stalled, it has not!! Progress is being made and actions have been taken. All answers to the questions have been compiled, and the 5 main themes that we, as a parish stated we wanted to focus on in the coming years are:

1 - **Accessibility**, in terms of both our physical space, as well as "invisible" barriers to attending here... such as our "walls" and transportation. Update: the process has begun to create an additional parking area for better handicap access to the sanctuary and parish hall.

2 - **Communication**, both within our parish as well as to the community. Update: we have begun re-doing and updating our website, we are streaming our 10 o'clock service live on Facebook, and are always looking for better ways to communicate.

3 - **Children and Youth Programing**, we are a growing parish, and have an increasing number of chil-

dren and families attending. Father John blessed 27 school-aged children as they headed back to school in August - and this didn't even account for the ones that were out of town and all the babies in our midst. Update: we have hired Debbie Butcher as our Children and Youth Coordinator and she's working fast and furious to get our programs on a consistent path.

4 - **Administration**, looking at our staffing structure and current challenges to ensure we have in place what is needed for growth. Update: we will re-convene a personnel committee to assist with this. Lastly, **5-Building Community**, again, both within our own parish family, as well as joining with other churches or faiths to strengthen our community. Update - we held a Time/Talent fair to allow everyone the opportunity to see where they can fit in and ask questions about various outreach and volunteer opportunities. Evangelism “Welcoming” Committee

If you're like me, the period of time immediately following Labor Day to roughly the present seems like a total blur! I clearly remember the Saturday after Labor Day, Chris and I were watching The Weather Channel and it became apparent that our beautiful area was not going to avoid the impacts of Hurricane Florence. From that point, we went into what I like to call “go-mode.” We began preparing our home for the storm, we went back and forth at least 100 times as to whether or not to evacuate, we finally made the decision to evacuate to a hotel in Richmond, Virginia on Wednesday morning (Chris, me, Mallory, 2 dogs and our cat). We remained in “evacuation mode” for 5 days; we made the long trip back (loaded down with supplies); and then, we surveyed the damage and went into “recovery mode.” The next two weeks seem like a blur of cleaning up ceiling/roof damage, tarping, LOTS of raking, LOTS of Chef Boyardee, and LOTS of counting our blessings that things didn't turn out worse for our family. As we ventured out and about around our community, our feelings of “relief” that things could have been worse were coupled with feelings of great sadness, as we became witness to ever-growing piles of debris and literally, the entire contents of some family homes sitting on the side of the road. More and more, the stories of total loss and devastation were told and the sadness grew as we thought of our neighbors and friends who weren't so fortunate. It became remarkably clear that Florence would be a storm that would result in months and maybe years of clean-up and recovery and certainly, a storm that would live on in the hearts and minds of us all, for many years to come.

I remember seeing a picture on Facebook of the first church service held post-Florence. The church still had no power. The doors were open to help with the heat, and candles provided a bit of extra light. It looked like perhaps 10 or so people were there and Father John, as always, led the service with a smile as wide as the high-rise bridge (and I mean that as a HUGE compliment), He was helping those folks fill their spiritual cups and helping instill hope and promise of better days to come, even though, at the time, the church had a basement full of

water and there remained many “unknowns.” I wasn't able to attend that day, but something about seeing that photo on Facebook, just brought me a tremendous amount of joy. It represented resilience, positivity, faithfulness, hope, new promise and more than anything, trust. Trust that even in the darkest of days, God will provide and no matter the weather, God's love always surrounds us.

Seeing our church and the greater community come together in what has, perhaps, been our greatest time of need that most can remember, has really been the silver lining of Florence. I have heard so many stories of so *many of you* lending a hand to your neighbors and friends, of our Thrift Store offering free merchandise to those in need, of the various dog rescue organizations that drove all the way down from Pennsylvania/New York/New Jersey with several truckloads of supplies to pass out to the community (their operation, of course, was based in our Parish Hall), of our Faith In-Deed crew who helped the residents of Ekklesia recover, of Father John's consistent encouragement and calming presence, which reminded us all that “all will be well.” So many examples of so much greatness, and so much faith and such an outpouring of God's love.

We are fortunate to be part of such an amazing and loving church community. Especially in light of Florence and recent events, it's likely that many are searching for a church home, or for a sense of community, so they don't feel so alone. If you know of someone looking for some love, light and hope, and some calm “after the storm,” consider asking them to join us for a service at St. Andrew's. It's clear there are so many ways we can radiate God's love to so many. It would be a blessing to extend our beautiful reach to others, who would open their hearts to all we have to offer.

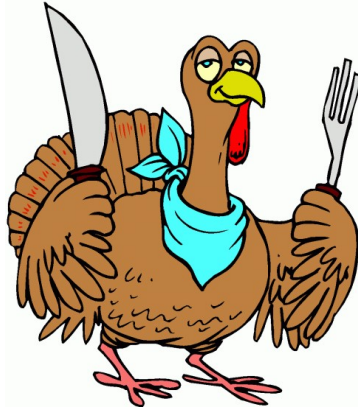

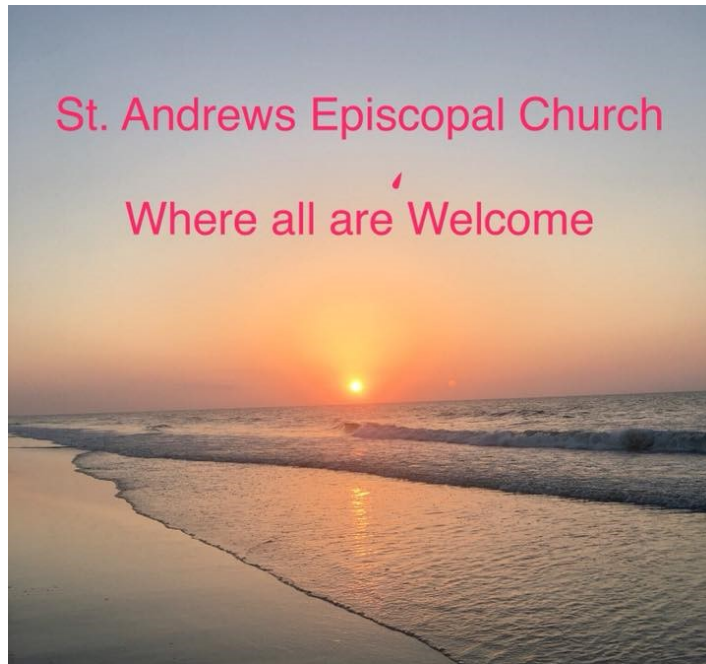
