Contemplative Corner

ver the past couple of years I have become more and more drawn to what is called by some the "contemplative dimension" of spirituality. It began with my interest in Centering Prayer, a form of still or silent prayer. This does not eliminate or replace spoken prayers with images and words. It enhances my prayer life by helping me be still, attentive and mindful.

I have recently tried to introduce the concepts of centering prayer and contemplative spirituality to our church. But what I've noticed when I talk about the topic, is that many people get this blank look in their face, as if I were speaking a foreign language. I try to explain it further, but find myself getting stuck in the weeds of words they don't understand. Finally a typical response is something like, "That's sounds nice for you Father John. But I don't think it's for me. Thanks." Most christians today see contemplative spirituality as something only for monks, nuns and spiritual elites, but not for them. And that's understandable.

So, I want to try to change all that. I want to demystify contemplative spirituality for us. I want to try to strip it of its esoteric mystique. No more "Woo Woo" language. You don't have to burn candles or ring bells... unless that's your thing. Contemplative spirituality is as natural to the christian as saying "Amen" at the end of a





prayer. It's as accessible to us as walking in the door of the church and sitting silently staring at the stained glass window and waiting for the worship service to begin. It's as normal as both tears and giggles. I think that if we develop few simple and basic practices, we can begin to see more clearly the work of God in our lives and our world. I want you to see contemplative faith as something accessible and for you.

So, in this monthly newsletter, The Sounder, we are starting this section that I'm calling "The Contemplative Corner." In it you'll be able to read a few thoughts from me or others in our church about contemplative faith and practices that have been helpful to them. You'll learn some basic practices to get you started on the ancient path. And yes, you can find these practices both in the Bible, and in early Christianity and Judaism.

So here's your contemplative practice for this month. When you walk through the door of your home, take a few seconds to pause. In these few seconds take a slow breath in and out, feeling the air on the inhale and exhale. And then whisper a silent prayer... If you are leaving your home the prayer can be something like, "Go with me God, and help me see you in the day's activities." When you come home and enter through your door, pause with the prayer, "Thank you for your love and presence O God." An alternative is to pause, breath and just be still. Pay attention to how God is presence in your day, and in your comings and goings.

From the Rector's Desk...

June brings a transition for our church. First, we are entering summer. During the summer we are blessed to have vacationing visitors, as well as our part-time regulars, whom we call "Cottagers." We welcome you! Summer also brings a transition in our church liturgical calendar.

After the Fifty Days of Easter, we celebrate Pentecost (June 9th) and Trinity Sunday (June 16th); and then we enter the long season after Pentecost (beginning on June 23rd). The color of the season is Green. This long season "After Pentecost" used to be called "Ordinary Time" church parlance. Why "ordinary" you ask? Because we worship a God who has joined us in the ordinariness of life. God walks with us in the daily and most ordinary of ways. Born in a barn... baptized in water... blessing bread... blessing wine... suffering and dying in the flesh... resurrected still with wounds... Jesus touched the sinners and sick... Jesus healed people in mind, body and spirit... the Holy Spirit is closer than our breath... breathing Life into our daily existence. Yes, Christ is Present in everything. In everyone. There are no throwaways in God's Kingdom. God is active in your life. God is active in all life.

To prepare for both Pentecost and Trinity Sunday, I have been reading the book The Divine Dance, The Trinity and Your Transformation, by Richard Rohr. While we have always struggled over explaining the mystery that is The Holy Trinity, Rohr brings it closer home for me by saying that the Trinity os a "circle dance." An ancient word used for the Trinity is the perichoresis from the Greek peri which means "around" and choreisis which means "dance" or "movement;" as in choreography. The ancient Christians understood

God the Trinity as a dynamic, flowing circle dance of the Three in One. It's not a closed circle. The dance include us and all creation. We are both invited and included in the dance with God.

Finally, I leave you with the beautiful text of a hymn in The Hymnal 1982 entitled "Creating God" words by Jeffery Rowthorn. (b. 1934)

There are two tunes in the hymnal... Hymn numbers 394 and 395.

Creating God, your fingers trace the bold designs of farthest space; let sun and moon and stars and light and what lies hidden praise your might.

Sustaining God, your hands uphold earth's mysteries known or yet untold; let water's fragile blend with air, enabling life, proclaim your care.

Redeeming God, your arms embrace all now despised for creed or race; let peace, descending like a dove, make known on earth your healing love.

Indwelling God, your gospel claims one family with a billion names; let every life be touched by grace until we praise you face to face.

May the grace of our Creating, Sustaining and Redeeming God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, dwell in now and always.

100th Anniversary Service



On Wednesday October 30th, we will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the first service for St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.

On October 30, 1919, the Rev'd Dr. George Lay, rector of St. Paul's in Beaufort held a service for Episcopalians living in Morehead City in the home of Mrs. C.B. Wade. According to the record written by Dr. Lay, services were thereafter held weekly "with instruction at 7 PM every Thursday in a room over the Marine Bank." Later by request, a service was added on one Sunday a month in the afternoon. Father Lay would be rowed across the water from Beaufort to Morehead City for the services.
