

## **Contemplative Corner**

Centering Prayer: The Prayer of Consent

Usually when we think of prayer, we think of spoken prayers, with words which describe our petitions or desires to God. But this is only one expression of prayer. The Book of Common Prayer describes prayer as being either with or without words. In Christianity there is a long tradition of silent prayer without words or images. It is the opening up to God beyond words, thoughts or emotions.

#### As Psalm 46:10 says, "Be still and know that I am God."

Centering Prayer is a form of prayer without words or images, in which we sit for a period of time in silence and stillness, simply seeking to be in God's Loving Presence. As we sit to be still, we don't try to empty our minds; but rather we let go of thoughts as they occur. Centering Prayer is a practice of trusting God, and letting go of anything that distracts us from attention to God's Presence; and gently returning to that attentiveness... again and again. Much like daily life, Centering Prayer is a practice in faith. The benefits of a Centering Prayer practice include less anxiety, more patience with ourselves and others, increased kindness in daily interactions, and a better ability to let go of negativity. Another way of describing the benefits of Centering Prayer is found in scripture. *"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, gentleness and self-control."* (Galatians 5:22).

It's also important to remember that Centering prayer is a "No Judgement Zone." Don't judge yourself. God certainly doesn't. Even if you are bombarded by thoughts during your prayer time... it's Okay! You had plenty of practice in returning to God's Presence.

**St. Andrew's has a Centering Prayer group which meets every 2nd, 4th and 5th Thursday of the month at 5:15 PM in the church sanctuary.** Come join us. No experience or expertise necessary. We are all on a journey... And where ever you are on your journey of faith, you are welcome!

### So, here is the process of Centering Prayer in four steps:

**1. Choose a prayer word** as a symbol of your consent to God's Presence and Action within you. Don't worry too much about what the word is... It should be simple. Examples are Love, Peace, Jesus, Abba, Christ. Another acceptable option is to let your breath be your prayer word. The function of the prayer word is to serve as a touchstone, or a marker to return to being still and quiet when you get distracted.

**2. Sit comfortably** with your eyes closed, settle in briefly into being both outwardly and inwardly still and quiet.

**3. When you are engaged** with thoughts, gently and silently say the prayer word... as a way to remind yourself of your intention to sit quietly in God's Presence. Thoughts can be sensations, images, reflections, feelings or internal dialogue. The Prayer Word (sometimes also called a "Sacred Word.") is not a mantra to be repeated over and over. It is a simple, brief marker to come back to being still.

**4. At the end** of your prayer time, say a quiet prayer of gratitude. That's it.

## Come, Labor On. Who Dares Stand Idle?

Do you know that hymn? *Come, Labor On?* It happens to be one of my all-time favorites and each line of text draws out that deeply instilled Protestant Work Ethic that came from my childhood background in the Calvinists and Reformed theologies of the Pentecostal and Southern Baptist traditions.

While some may pull back at the thought of sharing some of those principles in our non-Calvinist/Reformed (and some would say, "not Protestant") church, many of us look at those influences on our lives with fondness; myself being in that latter category. This hymn, found at 541 in our own hymnal, is often set to the tune called Ora Labora, which, suitably, means, "work to pray." The tune Ora Labora, interestingly, was written by someone who was quite the go-getter. Dr. T. Tertius Noble was an English organist who, after causing quite the creative revival in his home country, moved to New York City to work at St. Thomas Episcopal Church on Fifth Avenue. There he founded the St. Thomas Choir School, which just celebrated its 100th anniversary this past March. He was also responsible for editing a portion of the 1916 and 1940 versions of The Hymnal for the Episcopal Church. It seems Dr. Noble was quite drawn to the idea of working as a form of prayer.





"Come, labor on. No time for rest, till glows the western sky, till the long shadows o'er our pathway lie, and a glad sound comes with the setting sun, "Well done, well done!""

You may ask, "why are you going on about work ethic and music?" You'll find a quote attributed to St. Augustine on the music page of the St. Andrew's website that says, "*Those who sing pray twice*." It seems the members of our music program are in for quite the busy schedule this Fall/Winter term. If they're praying twice for all the singing they're doing, they're truly living the *Ora Labora* ethic. Choir rehearsals for both our Adults and the Choristers resume on Wednesday, August 21st. 

Then, in June, some of our choristers will travel with Christ Church, Raleigh to New York City to sing Holy Eucharist at St. Thomas Episcopal on Fifth Avenue and later Evensong at The Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine where I was on music staff for three years and our retired bishop, Bp. Clifton Daniel, now serves as the Dean. What an exciting time to be a participant of our music program and a member of St. Andrew's! Come, labor on. Who dares stand idle? Not us.

## 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Service



On Wednesday October 30th, we will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the first service for St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.

On October 30, 1919, the Rev'd Dr. George Lay, Rector of St. Paul's in Beaufort held a service for Episcopalians living in Morehead City in the home of Mrs. C.B. Wade. According to the record written by Dr. Lay, services were thereafter held weekly "with instruction at 7 PM every Thursday in a room over the Marine Bank." Later, by request, a service was added on one Sunday a month in the afternoon. Father Lay would be rowed across the water from Beaufort to Morehead City for the services.
